## Implementation Checklist

Directions for LVAD Coordinators or Engineers: Use this tracking sheet to guide implementation of the LVAD Decision Aid

e place a	check to indicate whether at the time of Decision Aid (DA) administration:
1.	Coordinator <b>delivered the DA to the patient</b> after a physician identified them as a candidate for LVAD.
2.	Coordinator <b>explained to the patient what a decision aid is</b> and how it complements standard education.
3.	Coordinator <b>explained the concept of shared decision-making (SDM) to the patient</b> , including the process of working together to describe choices, offer support and make preference-based decisions.
4.	Coordinator <b>asked the patient about their primary goals</b> and how much they matter in their LVAD decision, using the 'LVAD and Your Values' worksheet in the DA.
5.	Coordinator discussed treatment options available to the patient, including risks and benefits of each.
6.	Coordinator <b>asked patient if he/she had any questions</b> , probed understanding of the information, and answered patient's questions.
7.	Coordinator <b>offered to facilitate a meeting with another LVAD patient</b> and showed the patient the 'Questions to Ask another LVAD Patient' booklet in the DA.
8.	Coordinator <b>encouraged the patient to use the DA</b> with physicians and showed patient the 'Questions to Ask your Doctor' booklet in the DA.
9.	Coordinator <b>referred the patient to a financial advisor and/or social worker</b> and showed the patient the 'Resources for LVAD Patients & Caregivers' booklet in the DA.
10	D. Coordinator <b>reviewed the Knowledge Quiz questions with patient</b> and corrected any misconceptions.

While all of these steps are recommended to facilitate shared decision making, you may decide to prioritize specific steps based on a patient's circumstances and decisional needs.
